Highway 14 East to Highway 22 South Turn right on Hoffman Rd. (past East High School, cross Victory Dr.) Hoffman Road becomes Glenwood Avenue (curvy road) Turn left onto Pohl Rd. The Center is the deep magenta building on the right corner

From the East:

Highway 14 West to Highway 22 South Turn right on Hoffman Rd. (past East High School, cross Victory Dr.) Hoffman Road becomes Glenwood Avenue (curvy road) Turn left onto Pohl Rd. The Center is the deep magenta building on the right corner

From the North:

Highway 169 South to Highway 22 South (one block past the last stop light in St. Peter) Turn right on Hoffman Rd. (past East High School, cross Victory Dr.) Hoffman Road becomes Glenwood Avenue (curvy road) Turn left onto Pohl Rd. The Center is the deep magenta building on the right corner

From the South:

Highway 169 North to Riverfront exit Turn right onto Riverfront Dr. (past West High School) Turn right onto Stoltzman Rd. (follow this road and signs to MSU) Turn left onto Stadium Rd. (drive up hill past MSU) Turn left onto Pohl Rd. (twin homes on corner) The Center is deep magenta, the last building on the corner

African Soul, American Heart Friday, April 3 • 7 p.m. Hope Interfaith Center Presented by Joseph Akol Makeer

The Hope Interfaith Center is proud to be hosting and sponsoring Joseph Makeer as he shares his story and mission. Joseph will share a short documentary about his being a "Lost Boy of Sudan", his journey to settling with his family in Fargo, ND, and his current mission, the founding of African Soul, American Heart Foundation, which uses the arts — literary, film,and photographic — to raise funds to build a boarding facility for orphans in Duk Payuel, South Sudan.

Joseph Akol Makeer and Kevin Brooks, one of the documentary's producers and writers and a foundation Board of Directors member, will present the 23-minute documentary and answer questions after the screening. African Soul, American Heart shows the human spirit at its best!

Like thirty thousand or more Sudanese children (accounts of the total numbers who left and did not survive the initial walk are uncertain), Joseph Akol Makeer walked away from his village. He was ten and it was 1987. Twenty years later, he returned to his village to make a documentary. African Soul, American Heart tells how Joseph, a Fargo, North Dakota resident and a Sudanese Lost Boy who survived against all odds to thrive in his adopted country, now finds himself torn between responsibilities. He has been caring for younger siblings since 1998, and he has three children born in America. Yet he dreams of helping the orphaned children who live in his village in South Sudan.

The Sunday Noon Meal serves a healthy, full meal to those in our area who are in need of nourishment and fellowship. It is served every Sunday and uses the Salvation Army sight as its base facility.

Currently more than 100 guests are served each Sunday. This mission came out of the Mankato Hunger Task Force which was formed in the mid-80s, starting with 5 churches sharing the task and now has evolved into a base of 14 spiritual communities working together! Hope Interfaith Center has agreed to provide and serve twice during each year.

Serving the Sunday Noon Meal involves the following: We will need approximately 16 people/units to help donate, make and serve the food. There are five categories – the main dish, a vegetable, salad, bread, butter and milk, and dessert. Penny has more information and there is a sign up sheet at the Center.

On the Sunday we serve, we will meet at the Salvation Army at 11 a.m. The meal is served from noon to 1 p.m. and all volunteers should be able to leave, following clean up, by 1:30.

This is a very worthwhile way to serve others and a good family activity, too. If you are unable to help serve that day, you can donate food (ask what is needed) or money to buy the food – there are many options available to come forward and serve!
